At this point, you will be connected. Give your name and say "Hello". This will allow the chairman to keep attendance. You may call from any phone. Therefore, if you are on vacation or not able to call from your residence; use any available phone, including your cell. It is really a very simple and effective way to have a meeting.

Zoom meetings

A benefit of membership is the ability to host Zoom meetings. This can allow your Garden Club to hold a virtual meeting. Members can connect via smart phone, tablet, laptop, computer or phone. You can continue to enjoy must of the same things you love about meeting regularly. Change could be good? Imagine your next meeting when you can show your favorite garden plant virtually with the whole club?

If you have a member who is comfortable with technology, it would be good to have them available to help other members.

Assign a Zoom host to run the meeting - good practice to have someone other than the officers if possible. Each member will need to download the Zoom app and create an id. https://zoom.us/signup
After that, all you need is the date and time of meeting, meeting ID and Password!
